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EDITORIALS

A MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT OF FRANCE, EMMANUEL MACRON

Emmanuel Macron was personally involved in France's bid to host the 2024 edition of the WorldSkills Competition: «We shall be a showcase for the excellence of the skills and the commitment of young people every day,» he said in March 2018.

The French President has since reaffirmed his commitment to vocational training, which he describes as a "national cause", on a number of occasions. In a speech he gave about the reform of vocational schools to students from Saintes vocational school on 4 May 2023, he had this to say:

// "In September 2024, France and Lyon will host the wonderful WorldSkills Competition, where young people under the age of 23 from 70 countries will be able to showcase their professional capabilities side by side across 62 skills. We are proud to be doing so, and every year I welcome the young people who win these competitions. And in 2024 we are going to organize it. They are young people who have taken the career paths you want to take. They are young people who have sometimes been told: 'Go and do that because you don't know how to do anything else.' They are young people who went unrecognized. But because there was a teacher, a company or a group of people that believed in them, they now find themselves representing France in international competitions and showcasing their skills with pride".

THE WORLDSKILLS MOVEMENT

MORE THAN 70 YEARS OF HISTORY

The WorldSkills Competition has its origins in the period of austerity in Spain after the Second World War; it has now grown to become an international movement. Beginning in 1947 under the leadership of Francisco Albert Vidal, the movement gradually grew to an international scale and France joined in 1953. Today, over 85 countries and regions are Members.

A VISION FOR FUTURE GENERATIONS

The WorldSkills movement was created to bring countries from the whole world together to develop the skills of young professionals. Its goal now is to develop vocational training standards, encourage innovation, and promote skilled careers and trades around the globe.

Every two years, WorldSkills International therefore organizes the world's biggest skills competition. Over several days of events, young professionals who are under 26 years old from the 5 continents, represent their nation on the global stage.

The WorldSkills movement is more than just a Competition, it strives to fight against preconceptions about vocational training. It is a matter of meeting the challenges faced by these sectors that are under economic pressures, and of encouraging young people to choose these future professions, which are not only in high demand, but are also vectors of excellence, professional success, and fulfillment.

INNOVATION, INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION AROUND THE CHALLENGES OF PROFESSIONAL TRAINING, GIVING EVERYBODY A CHANCE TO FIND THEIR CAREER PATH: WORLDSKILLS IS AN ANSWER TO TOMORROW'S CHALLENGES, TO BUILD THE FUTURE

What we have observed: Young people who are seeking employment and a vocation struggle to find work, industries are short of talent, there is a lack of political investment on the part of decision makers in the vocational and technical training sectors, and some professions are misunderstood, despite their potential to change the world.

Only one out of four young people from around the world is in the process of acquiring the skills they need to get a job, whether through education, employment or training. At the same time, the UN estimates that there will be 1.78 million more young people in the world by 2030. Favoring the acquisition of skills in promising professions is therefore a major issue for combating poverty, mass unemployment, parallel economies, and promoting social and economic progress in all the countries around the world.

WorldSkills believes in the power of vocational training and skills to facilitate cooperation between countries. Alongside its 85+ members and Global Partners, the WorldSkills movement brings together stakeholders from the whole world to encourage the sharing of professional technical innovations and development, and to celebrate skills and Technical and Vocational Education and Training (TVET).

THE WORLD'S BIGGEST SKILLS COMPETITION: A CAREER BOOSTER FOR YOUNG PEOPLE

“The WorldSkills Competition was a massive boost to the development of my skills. I met a former Champion who spoke to me about his experience and suggested that I sign up for it. When I saw the skills he had developed by taking part in the WorldSkills Competition, it inspired me. I experienced so much during those four days of competition. The pressure was huge. After my victory, I received a lot of job offers in France and internationally.”

WORLDSKILLS LYON 2024: MUCH MORE THAN A COMPETITION

A UNIQUE PLATFORM TO MEET THE CHALLENGES FACED BY FRANCE: THE WORLDSKILLS LYON 2024 ORGANIZING COMMITTEE.

WorldSkills Lyon 2024 is the body responsible for organizing the WorldSkills Competition in September 2024. As a real platform to promote professions, WorldSkills Lyon 2024 is a portfolio of events designed to bring together and inspire action among participants in skills and vocational training in France and around the world, based on our values of Openness, Generosity, Unity and Excellence. With 250,000 visitors expected, including 100,000 school students, WorldSkills Lyon 2024 is making raising youth awareness one of its priorities.

Alongside its institutional partners and Sponsors, WorldSkills Lyon 2024 offers school students fun and educational insights to discover skills and the associated vocational training, whilst inspiring the next generation of young talents.

Another objective of WorldSkills Lyon 2024 is to leave a sustainable and tangible legacy, and to offer a new model for a viable, long-lasting global Competition that is on the right scale to be reproduced by host countries and regions in future editions.

WORLDSKILLS IS CALLING ON COUNTRIES TO TAKE ACTION TO SHARE AND CELEBRATE EACH NATION'S SKILLS, TALENTS AND KNOW-HOW.

French-speaking Project

The WorldSkills movement currently includes seven Francophone countries: Belgium, Canada, France, Luxembourg, Morocco, Switzerland, and Tunisia. WorldSkills France and WorldSkills Lyon 2024 want to make the 47th WorldSkills Competition a global meeting point for young people, skills and professions, particularly for these countries.

Hosting the Competition in France in 2024 is an opportunity to open up the WorldSkills movement and to introduce it to the French network abroad, to make a connection between France and the vocations, actions and roles of French-speaking operators and participants in speaking French abroad, and to support the participation of Francophone countries in WorldSkills Lyon 2024.

WorldSkills France and WorldSkills Lyon 2024 aim to act with regard to:

- Young people: by inciting and motivating young people with new challenges and new opportunities, by including more young people in the WorldSkills experience, and getting closer to young people to stimulate creativity and innovation
- Education: promoting the quality of French training courses, winning assets and differentiating towards excellence
- Economics: by supporting the performance of French companies and economic growth in France and abroad
- Culture: by presenting the wealth of expertise and the heritage of professions in France, whilst using the French language as a tool to facilitate transmission

Africa Program

There are 12 African countries and regions that are Members of WorldSkills International: Democratic Republic of the Congo, Egypt, Ethiopia, Ghana, Kenya, Morocco, Namibia, Nigeria, South Africa, Tunisia, Uganda, and Zambia.

WorldSkills International has been working with the African Union Commission and the African Union Development Agency on the development of WorldSkills Africa, which is a regional platform that was officially launched in February 2024 at the Heads of State Summit of the African Union.

Being the key platform to harness the power of skills for Africa's development, capacity building of trainers is one of the key elements for WorldSkills Africa to strengthen the TVET systems in the continent. Using the opportunity of the next regional competition taking place in Livingstone Zambia – WorldSkills Africa Livingstone 2025 – a capacity building programme for trainers will be launched in late 2024 with the aim to provide technical mentorship and competition preparation.

The first WorldSkills Africa Competition was held in 2018 in Kigali, Rwanda, with six countries, seven skills and 25. In 2022, the second WorldSkills Africa Competition took place in Namibia. Around 70 Competitors, and a team of refugees from nine African countries took part to win medals in 16 skills.

WorldSkills International and WorldSkills Lyon 2024 are fully invested to support the participation of the African continent in the 47th WorldSkills Competition and to create a WorldSkills Africa regional body within the African Union.

For the WorldSkills Lyon 2024 Competition, a specific welcome program has been designed in partnership with the French Development Agency (AFD):

- A privileged meeting session and participation in events at the Competition in order to be fully immersed in the ecosystem, its operation and its challenges.
- Organization of a friendly competition in the skill of basketry alongside the WorldSkills Competition. The participating countries are Côte d'Ivoire, Senegal, Cameroon, Burundi, Madagascar, the DRC, Benin and France (Metz National Basketry School). This event will be an opportunity for each country to share its expertise and, best practices with its peers and interested visitors.

INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION AROUND THE ISSUES REGARDING TECHNICAL AND VOCATIONAL EDUCATION AND TRAINING (TVET) AT THE HEART OF THE WORLDSKILLS COMPETITION LYON 2024.

WORLDSKILLS CONFERENCE

The WorldSkills Conference will be held on 11 and 12 September 2024 at WorldSkills Lyon 2024, on the theme of «Moving TVET to the top of the global agenda». The global stakeholders in the skills sector are meeting in Lyon to discuss the drafting of policies and the implementation of TVET. Leaders in education, governments, companies and industry from around the whole world will draw on the energy, relationships and the media presence of WorldSkills Lyon 2024 to influence the United Nations Summit of the Future, which will be held on 22 and 23 September 2024, and to ensure that TVET is recognized as an essential component of the post-2030 agenda.

The 2024 WorldSkills Conference offers a platform for participants in TVET to come together and discuss the most urgent issues of our time and to think boldly about how to develop skills. The aim is to offer innovative formats of sessions, to increase the possibilities for connections and commitment between the stakeholders, and to continue to give young people a central and pivotal role in all the discussions.

The different sessions of the 2024 WorldSkills Conference explore different strategies for a global TVET program that can respond to the demographic, ecological and digital transformations that are having an impact on the life and work of people around the whole world. The discussions cover:

- Quality and excellence in TVET
- Social justice
- Adapting TVET to fragile economies and informality
- Skills for the green transition
- Digitalization and Artificial Intelligence

YOUTH FORUM

This Youth Forum, which follows on from the Abu Dhabi Youth Forum organized in 2017 during the previous WorldSkills Competition in the United Arab Emirates, picks up where the preceding edition left off, whilst adopting a new format and a new concept.

As part of the WorldSkills International Conference, this Forum brings together young professionals and politicians. The guiding principle of this event is «Young people talk to political decision makers».

Once again built around the theme of the future of skills and vocational training, the Youth Forum organized in Lyon is primarily aimed at promoting the dialogue necessary between young people, who are central to the issues in the field, and the decision makers responsible for orienting public policies regarding training and employment.

THE CENTERS OF VOCATIONAL EXCELLENCE (COVE)

The Centers of Vocational Excellence (CoVE) were designed to modernize teaching and vocational training systems in Europe and increase their level of excellence.

The European Commissioner allocated €400 million to achieve the European target of establishing at least 100 of these Centers of Vocational Excellence by 2027. They form a strong community that has organized annual meetings bringing together the best participants in teaching and vocational training since 2022. The main aim is to assemble educational and training service providers, national and regional governments, companies, etc. to share their knowledge, to draw inspiration and learn from each other.

A COMMITMENT TO YOUNG PEOPLE AND EDUCATION

COMMITMENT TO YOUNG PEOPLE AND EDUCATION: HALF OF THE 250,000 VISITORS WILL BE SCHOOL STUDENTS

With the support of its sponsors and institutional partners, WorldSkills Lyon 2024 is pushing ahead with a very ambitious educational project. A number of programs for school students that will be game changers for skills and vocational training will be rolled out in the wake of the Competition.

The aim is to create an immersive visitor experience for young people at the Competition venue, and to use the WorldSkills Lyon 2024 event to raise awareness among students and teachers.

ONE SCHOOL ONE COUNTRY PROGRAM

- 52 schools in the city of Lyon and the surrounding area
- 1,400 Competitors visiting local schools
- A unique encounter between local students and Competitors from around the world.

One School One Country (OSOC) is a cultural exchange program that will see schools in the Greater Lyon area matched with a WorldSkills Member country or region. It will give students the opportunity to learn more about the skilled careers represented at the Competition and to discover the values, traditions and culture of the country they have been matched with. In a spirit of exchange, schools invite Competitors to meet with students on the morning of the Opening Ceremony. Students will also have the chance to attend the WorldSkills Competition Lyon 2024 to see their Competitors in action.

As the first people youngsters turn to for guidance, teachers will also be made aware of the opportunities offered by vocational education and training in terms of career pathways and as a means for their students to achieve excellence and fulfillment.

A DEDICATED EXPERIENCE TO GUIDE VISITORS AND COMPETITORS CLOSELY.

WorldSkills Lyon 2024 offers an innovative visitor experience to direct young people towards careers in TVET, with unique systems to allow them to find out about professions under a new light: immersive entry, event/exhibition areas, and informative and interactive content. The aim is to make WorldSkills Lyon 2024 a sharing and friendly experience, bringing together the Competitors, the organization, the Visitors and all those who promote skills.

TRY-A-SKILL

For anyone who is trying to find their way, it can be inspiring to watch Competitors excel in their chosen skill. At the same time, however, it can seem daunting and beyond their reach.

With the «Try-a-Skill» activity program, WorldSkills Lyon 2024, its partners and sponsors will lay on practical workshops for visitors to the Competition. Everybody can take part and all the workshops are open to school students, who are the main target. Allowing people to try their hand at a skill helps make the Competition an interactive experience and lets them picture where their career might take them, and find out what their hands can do.

VOLUNTEERS PROGRAM

2,500 Volunteers from a wide range of backgrounds contribute to the smooth running of the Competition through 50 roles distributed over 15 families of skills. Designed for all kinds of people, including children from the age of 16 accompanied by an adult, the Volunteers Program is a unique opportunity to discover the skills that make up the Competition, the behind-the-scenes of the organization of a major international event, and the professions of the organizing teams.

The Volunteers play a key role in ensuring the Competition runs smoothly, though there is more to the program than just a recruitment drive. It also projects our values, which are central to our approach to legacy and our commitment to including all types of people in our project.

The WorldSkills Lyon 2024 Volunteers Program:

- Allows Volunteers to obtain a certification at the end of their assignment to acknowledge this experience as part of their professional career
- Is the first Volunteers Program that can include minors from the age of 16
- Was prepared with back-to-work training bodies to involve people who have dropped out of the job market

«We carry on after the games!»

A program that acts as a gateway to sports and professional skills has also been developed: Sport & Skills. This program, which is aligned with the road map set out by different ministries to promote insertion in and through sport, has made it possible for the WorldSkills Competition Lyon 2024 to be awarded the label «Grande Cause Nationale» [Major National Cause]:

The Organizing Committee wishes to promote the power of sport in relation to young people and its action as a lever for social and professional inclusion:

- By celebrating the values shared by skills competitions and sports competitions: excellence, commitment, discipline, teamwork, surpassing yourself, perseverance, respect and fraternity.
- By highlighting the connections and parallels between athletes and WorldSkills Competitors.

The WorldSkills Competition Lyon 2024 includes the travelling photo exhibition «Le Bon Geste au Bon Moment» [The Right Gesture at the Right Time] that draws a parallel between the **excellence of professional and sporting gestures**. The aim is to promote the skills acquired through sport and their value in the professional world

A PROJECT WITH A MAJOR CSR IMPACT

WorldSkills Lyon 2024 aims to inspire the organizers of future Competitions and the Lyon region to adopt a more sustainable approach to organizing events.

That is why a demanding and measurable CSR strategy has been developed including both sustainable and socially responsible objectives in terms of accessibility, inclusion and the virtuous economy.

WorldSkills Lyon 2024 is committed to transparency and fully intends to put its words into action. Its goals are founded on complying with recognized standards and certifications, in particular the ISO 20121 certification, the main standard attesting to the sustainability of an event and its management system.

Some of the skills in the Competition are also central to the energy transition that our societies must undertake. Renewable energy sources have recently been included as professions represented during the Special Edition of the WorldSkills Competition organized in 2022. A previous Champion, Sonya Hill, who competed in the Mobile Robotics profession and who now works in the renewable energy sources sector, bears witness to the concrete involvement of her profession:

«I am a specialist solar energy engineer. I mostly concentrate on designing 3D representations of solar power systems, including hybrid systems connected to the grid. Solar energy systems have an important role to play in contributing to a greener future. By using the energy of the sun, solar power helps to reduce greenhouse gas emissions, which are a major factor in the increase in temperatures around the world and climate change.»

CSR ACTIONS TAKEN

Ecology:

WSL2024 is measuring its carbon footprint before and after the event.

All of the stands for the sponsors and partners adhere to the principles of eco-design to minimize the environmental impact, and at least 30% of the catering offering is vegetarian. The crockery is reusable, the foodstuffs are local and seasonal produce, with a system for redistributing leftover food, and there are drinking fountains across the whole Competition venue.

The whole venue is covered by a recycling and composting system with more than ten lines of waste sorting.

Accessibility:

All of the sites open to the public are accessible by wheelchair users, and digital and physical systems to enhance the hosting capacity and accessibility are deployed for people with physical, sensory and cognitive disabilities:

- French sign language interpreters are available on the accessibility stand on the days when the Competition is open.
- A Competition venue orientation application with specific functions for people with physical, visual and, cognitive disabilities.
- Skill facilitators to explain the Competitions verbally.

A general-awareness raising and a safety management protocol against discrimination, harassment and, violence are implemented for the event.

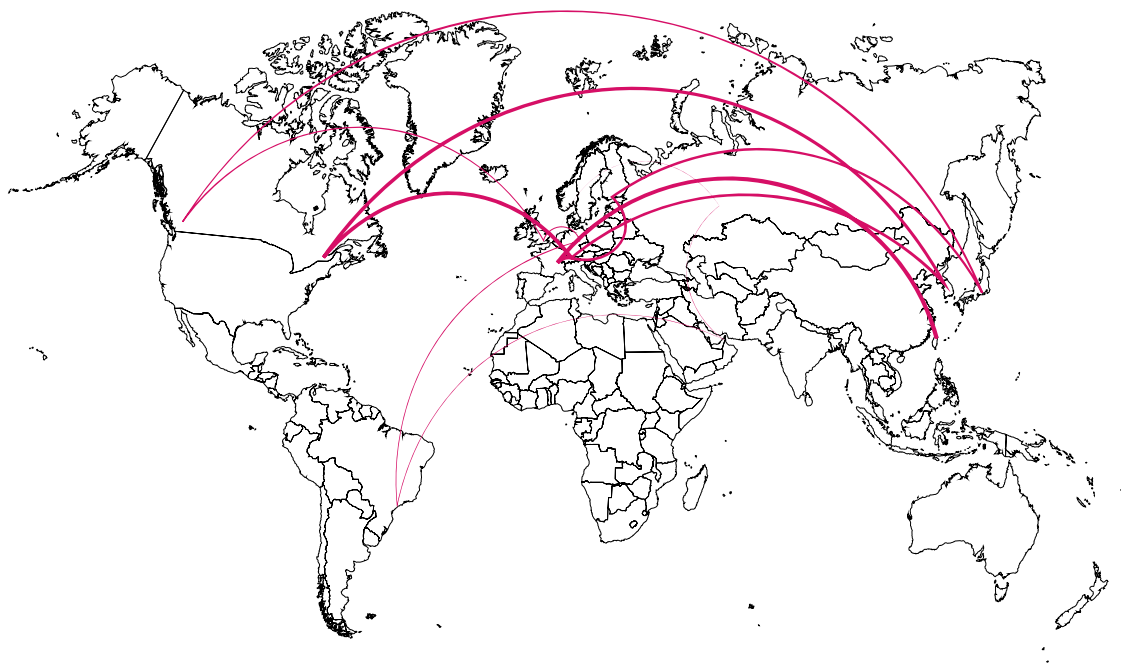
A re-use system (donation and resale) for the materials and equipment used for the Competition after the event is in place to promote the circular economy.

The WorldSkills Competition is back in Lyon almost 30 years after the first outing! This edition is the first time since 2013 that the Competition has been held in central Europe, where it has its roots.

In 1995, the 33rd edition of the Competition was held in Lyon with nearly 500 Competitors from 25 countries, and 38 skills were represented. This year, there will be 1,400 Competitors from 69 countries and regions representing 59 skills.

These figures bear witness to the vitality of the WorldSkills movement, which has become a real global showcase for professional skills. The organization has evolved from a simple regional competition in Spain to a prestigious international event, bringing together thousands of young talents across a wide range of skills.

It is an immense honor for France to host the WorldSkills Competition in Lyon after 30 years of absence.

59 SKILL COMPETITIONS – 3 EXHIBITION SKILLS

For a particular skill to qualify for a Competition, a minimum of 14 countries must enter a Competitor. Skill demonstrations are a WorldSkills tradition and are left to the discretion of the Competition Organizer. They are generally chosen by the host country to promote a skill that reflects its expertise or to showcase a particular skill with the aim of it being included on the official program at the next edition.

At Lyon 2024, the 47th WorldSkills Competition, some 59 skill competitions and 3 skill demonstrations will be spread across six sectors. The skill demonstrations selected by WorldSkills Lyon 2024 to promote French expertise are Stonemasonry, Heavy Truck Maintenance and, Rail Vehicle Technology.

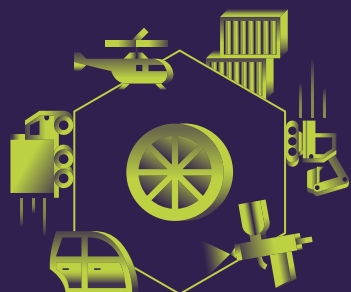
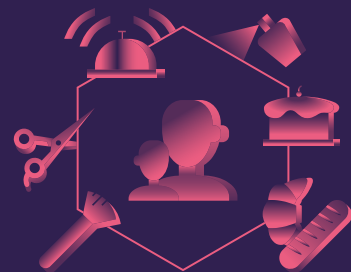

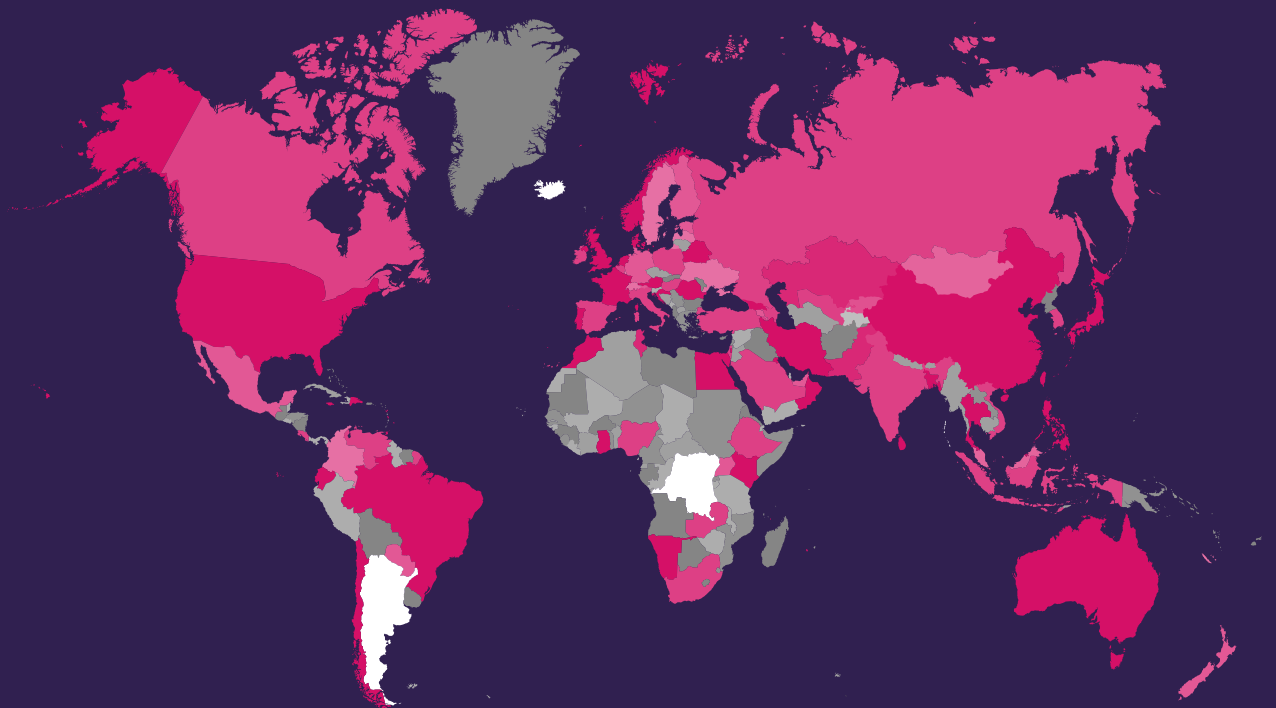

5. The Medallists are announced and the awards are presented during the Closing Ceremony.

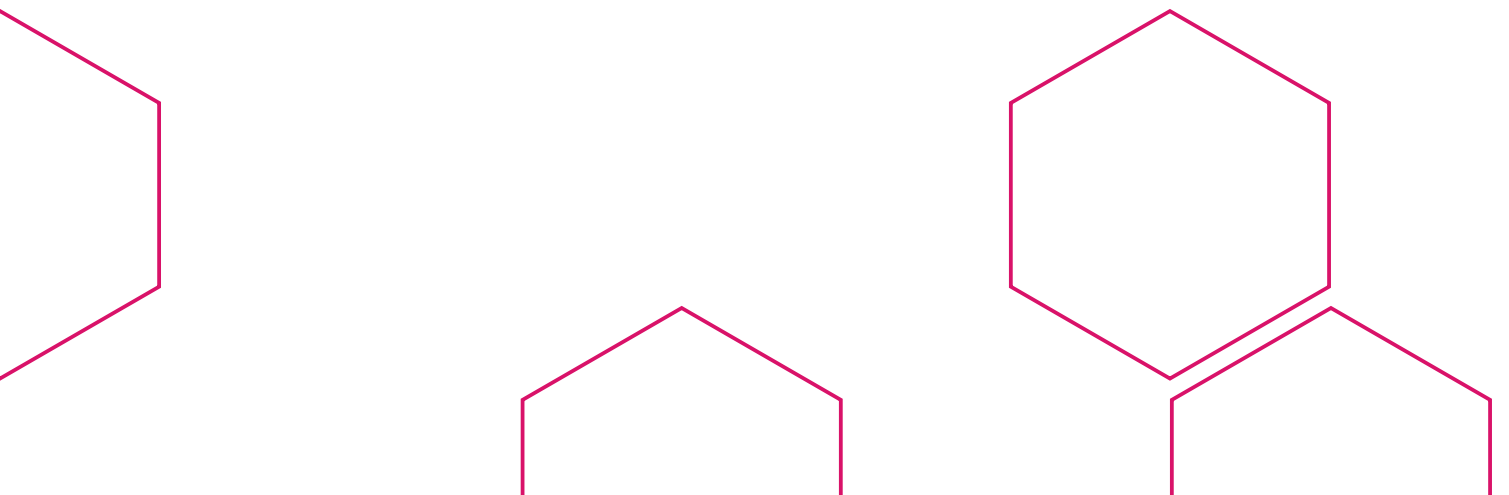

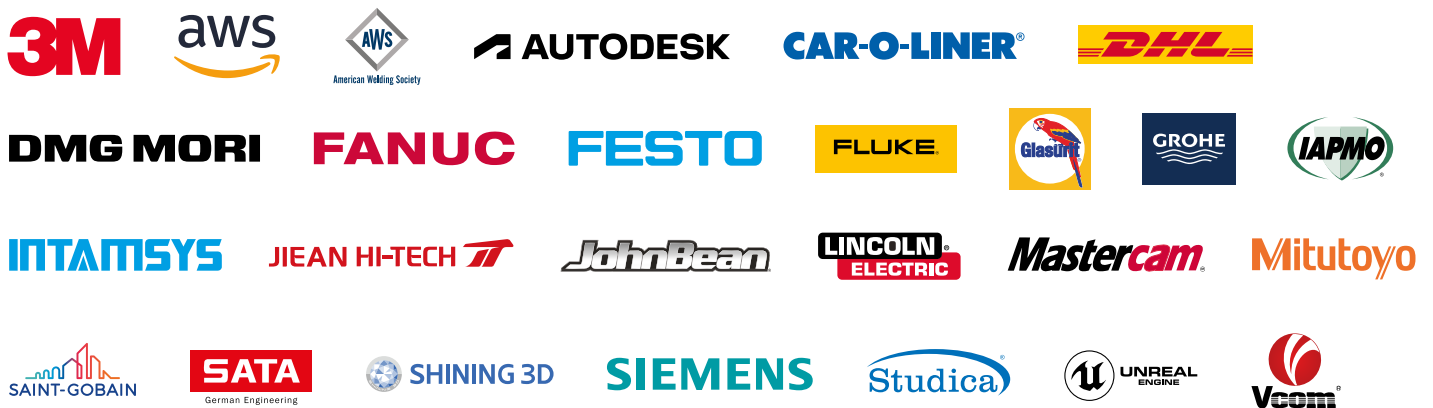
